

Kangiqsualujjuaq means "the very large bay" in Inuktitut, dut to its position at the end of George River bay.



History

Kangiqsualujjuaq, often called George River, is the easternmost village in Nunavik. It is located 160 km away from Kuujjuaq and 1675 km away from Montreal. In the 19th century, a trading post of the Hudson Bay Company was established 12 km south of the current location of the village, which was created only in 1962 when the Inuit decided to settle there, especially for arctic char trade.

Kangiqsualujjuaq can be reached by plane by taking a Canadian North flight from Montreal/Quebec to Kuujjuaq then an Air Inuit flight from Kuujjuaq to Kangiqsualujjuaq.



Smoking in the transit and bringing your spouse is forbidden. Animals are not allowed.




The transit is equipped. TV and cable are included, but there is no access to the Internet and long-distance calls are not possible with the transit phone.
