

Kangirsuk means "the bay" in Inuktitut, because the village is located in Payne Bay.



Access

Kangirsuk can be reached by plane by taking a Canadian North flight from Montreal/Quebec to Kuujuaq then an Air Inuit flight from Kuujuaq to Kangirsuk.

History

Kangirsuk is 230 km north of Kuujuaq and 1750 km away from Montreal. This village is surrounded by a cliff and a hill, both of them rocky. It is said that traces of Viking settlements from the 11th century can be found on Pamiok, an island near Kangirsuk. The village developed with trading posts in the 1920s.

Fishing, hunting, businesses and services, tourism, construction, transport, outfitters, arts and crafts


